

Nature Activities for Spring



Take a Rainbow Walk

As you walk around the nature reserve, how many colours of the rainbow can you find? Look at the plants, animals and fungi and photograph/spot one of each colour to complete your rainbow!



Go on a Bug Hunt

Can you spot a butterfly, a bee, a spider, a worm, a ladybird and a fly on your visit? How many other little critters can you find? Try looking under leaves, logs and stones (make sure you pop them back afterwards), in the grass and on flowers.



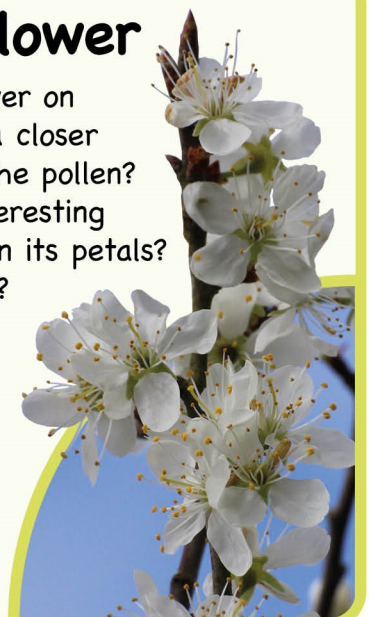
Listen to Spring Sounds

Sit quietly and listen to the birds singing, honking and drumming their springtime songs. Male birds use song to hold their territory and attract a mate – can you see the singer? What else can you hear? Bees buzzing, frogs croaking? The sound of the wind in the trees?



Inspect a Flower

Find a colourful flower on your visit and take a closer look. Can you spot the pollen? Does it have any interesting textures like hairs on its petals? Does it have a smell? What shape is it?
