## Look for Baby Animals

On your walk or in the bird hide, see if you can spot some baby animals. Look for ducklings, tadpoles, caterpillars and kits (baby rabbits). Listen for the sound of baby birds cheeping for their parents too. Remember to keep your distance to avoid scaring them.



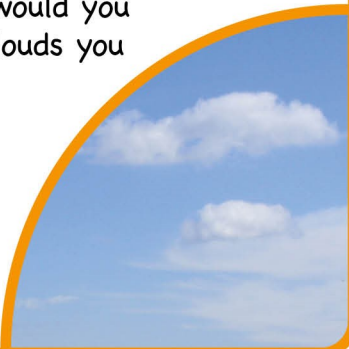
## Become a Wildlife Detective

Find and investigate evidence of animal activity. Are those holes on a leaf made by a caterpillar or beetle larva? Whose droppings are those on the ground? What animal came out of that empty case? See if you can solve the clues!



## Cloud Spotting

Lie down on the grass and watch the clouds. Can you spot any shapes? Do any of them look like animals? How would you describe the clouds you can see?



## Listen to Summer Sounds

Sit quietly on the grass and listen to the crickets and the grasshoppers chirping. Can you spot one? What else can you hear? Birds cheeping? Flies buzzing? The sound of the breeze in the grass? Does it have a smell? What shape is it?



## Suggested Craft Activity to do at Home



Make a water station for bees and other insects. Use a shallow container (you could recycle a plastic container) and fill it with small stones or marbles. Add enough water to cover some of the stones or marbles but make sure some are sticking up out of the water.
